Twenty eight fine artists will exhibit and sell their work while enjoying an aesthetic setting nestled on the grounds of the Henderson Historical Society between the Henderson’s Historical Society’s authentically restored log cabin from 1812 and the Henderson Recreation Park on CT. Rt. 72. The Historical Society’s doors will be open to the public sharing their vast collection of artifacts and historical information with representatives available and ready to share the richness of Henderson’s town history.

Contributing greatly to the ambiance of the cultural event, sponsored by the HHACC, will be the live classical guitar music of Mr. Steve Lester with vocalist Diana Gamet. Steve Lester’s guitar playing has enhanced a wide variety of occasions from Shakespearean plays to jazz and bluegrass festivals. As a jazz student he studied from the famous Joe Pass and Barney Kessel. As a classical student he earned a performance degree at Salisbury University in Maryland and took two master classes from Christopher Parkening, considered the "heir to Andres Segovia." He recently retired from Fort Drum, NY after a 22-year career as a guitarist in the Army bands where he also served in Korea, Germany, Afghanistan, Virginia and New York City. He spent the 2007-08 school year teaching public school music in Upper Marlboro, Md. and is happy to return to the North Country where he now works for the Watertown Daily Times, plays guitar regularly at Tin Pan Galley in Sackets Harbor, and teaches privately in Watertown at North Country Music. Accompanying Mr. Lester is Ms. Diana Gamet who is studying for a dual degree in vocal performance and music education at Potsdam’s Crane school of Music. They will perform from noon-1:30pm.
